Another Terrific Two Rivers SWAT!

The second Two Rivers SWAT (Strategic Warriors at Training) held September 25 – October 2, 2004, proved a tremendous success. Many students from the first SWAT came back to receive advanced training in how to deal with the enemy in spiritual warfare. This week-long intensive course was again conducted in military format, and the theme of the course was “Advancing in the Kingdom of God.”

The students learned the importance of godly character and spiritual maturity, especially when doing spiritual warfare in teams. And the teachers and leaders stressed that walking in love and truth together was key to unity in the Spirit. Then believers can be effective in defeating the enemy and establishing God’s kingdom in the earth.

Charlene Johnson and Doris Epperson, representing the advanced and beginning groups, addressed the congregation. They shared some of the funny moments as well as the great advances in spiritual understanding that they had experienced.
