## New Format for 2004!

This school year instead of holding classes as usual, Two Rivers Native American Training Center is developing a new and cutting edge format of training: Boot Camp!

Beginning with a session scheduled from May 10 to May 21, 2004, there will be various 10-day "boot camps" spread throughout the year. The formal title will be **Strategic Warriors At Training**, or **SWAT**.

Its vision is to develop warriors, by creating a specialized "commando" group that will engage and set the order of discipline that will tear down the first line of defense against the enemy. The goal is that students will be sent forth from the Boot Camp fully equipped to challenge and dismantle the entities that are hidden in the vast mixtures of religion in Indian Country.

The Boot Camp will be lead by Two Rivers co-founder Dr. Jay Swallow, a man who has proven experience in dealing with strongholds in the Native American community. He will be teaching many avenues, including "Identifying Strongmen" in areas that affect Reservations from the Plains Indian perspective.

Two Rivers co-founder Dr. Negiel Bigpond will be teaching about covenant, honor, native authority over the land, and key issues of The Trail of Tears from a Woodland Indian perspective.

Two Rivers wants to emphasize that these Boot Camps are *not conferences*, but an intense time of training and skill building, designed to tear down the territorial spiritual strongholds of the enemy.

The camps will consist of ten 12-hour days of intense training, with nights revolving around "campfire" talks. These talks will include special guest speakers with



experience in warfare. The evenings will also be demonstrative of different Native style dances and music. It will provide insight as to why some forms of Native culture are not permissible in the Christian church. In addition, history of tribal cultures will also be presented, and students will be given the opportunity to participate in outdoor functions and activities, and Native American arts.

Students will be encouraged to live close to the natural elements on the 30 acre Two Rivers campus. They will sleep in camping tents and teepees, and meals will be provided camp meeting style. RV hookups will also be made available for those who are 40+, and we anticipate

that our new dormitory facility, The Garlock House, will be ready as well.

Two Rivers Native American Training Center has been moving in a positive direction for the last four years. We have been taking steps to fulfill the vision God has given us, although at times it seems like we are taking baby steps. We have learned and continue to learn, gaining unique skills and valuable wisdom, and we believe we have come a long way in understanding how to obey God in what he has asked us to do.

As part of the vision to provide vocational training at the school, we have built a silversmithing building, where Apostle and Two Rivers co-founder Jay Swallow will teach a course in jewelry-making, but we need \$2500 for a septic system and other finances to furnish the building with the necessary equipment. In this intensive 15-day class, students will have the opportunity to learn a valuable skill, with the ability to start their own business. Upon completion of the course, students will be provided a trip to Albuquerque, NM, where they will meet with various suppliers.

We are currently clearing the land in back of our facility to make way for an all-purpose building. Not only will it provide a recreational facility for the students of Two Rivers, but it will house a day-care center for children and provide a recreational facility for the youth in the surrounding area. Your monthly support of any amount (\$10 to \$1000) will help us introduce these families to the love of Jesus Christ.

Where two rivers meet has always been a sacred place to our Native people. Two Rivers Native American Training Center is where the Plains Tribes (Brother Jay Swallow) and the Woodland Tribes (Brother Negiel Bigpond) come together. It is an even more sacred place because two rivers of people join to bring the healing water of salvation and God's Word to all Native people.

Please consider becoming part of this important work by becoming covenant partners with us, not only financially but in prayer. We are in a great battle, but it is worth all the sacrifices to see our people come to know Jesus, to grow into maturity as His disciples, and then to go out and make more disciples.
